Our Mission Statement

The CASAs for Kids Fund was created to support the Tippecanoe County Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) program in its efforts to enrich the lives of abused and neglected children. The foundation accomplishes this end through raising, managing, and distributing funds to:

- Provide positive intervention for kids through educational assistance, goods, and other services which are not provided by another source
- Support CASA volunteers, staff, and other activities to further the goals of the CASA program
- Raise awareness of the community's opportunity to make a difference in children's lives.

Allocations

In 2018, the CASAs for Kids Fund provided \$25,288 to fulfill needs of 205 children. Those children were among the 714 served by the Tippecanoe County CASA Office. Requests were submitted by 132 CASA volunteers to deliver goods, services, extra-curricular activity fees and other items that build self-esteem and improve the lives of the children for whom they advocate.

Additionally, with the success of the Subaru CASA Cycling Challenge, the fund is able to provide the salary for a staff advocate. The staff advocate has nearly eliminated the waiting list of children still in need of a CASA. The fund also provides the CASA program \$25,000 annually for training, conferences, and volunteer recruitment, appreciation and retention.

2018 Subaru CASA Cycling Challenge

The 2018 Subaru CASA Cycling Challenge held Aug. 18-19 raised more than \$140,000 for abused and neglected children in Tippecanoe County. Twenty individuals raised more than \$1,000 each and were awarded Grand Champion jerseys to recognize their outstanding fundraising efforts. There were 2 virtual riders, 39 solo riders, and 47 teams. Individuals and teams were challenged to see how many miles they could ride in 24 hours on the smooth surface of Subaru's two-mile test track. Altogether, 350 cyclists participated. The presenting sponsor of the event, Subaru of Indiana Automotive, is an exceptional host and partner for our largest fundraiser of the year, both in participants and in dollars raised. She worked on the very first fundraiser for CASAs for Kids Fund, the Healthy Eating Extravaganza, which raised more than \$1,200. Mary joined the board after that event. She continues as a board member and served as board secretary from 2000-2018. The Margaret J. Hand Child Advocacy Award was established in 1999 to honor Judge Margaret Hand and a CASA volunteer or community member who is an exceptional advocate for children.
